How we are keeping our volunteers and construction sites safe in response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

Work areas will be at least six feet apart.



We will ensure hand sanitizer dispensers are always filled.



Any shared protective equipment will be sanitized before being used by another volunteer.

Construction site portable toilets will be cleaned at least three times per week.



HFHOC equipment and tools will be cleaned at least once per day and before and after use.



We will provide alcohol-based wipes and/or disinfectant spray to clean tools before and after each use.

Frequently touched items (i.e. door handles and toilet seats) will be disinfected after each use.



Any trash collected from the construction site will be changed frequently.

How you can keep yourself and other volunteers safe on a construction site in response to the COVID-19 pandemic:

Maintain physical distance
(at least six feet) at all times.



Wear a face
mask that
covers both
your mouth
and nose.



Frequently wash your hands
with soap and water for at
least 20 seconds.



When soap and water are unavailable, use
provided hand sanitizer.

Follow appropriate
respiratory etiquette,
which includes covering
for coughs and sneezes.



Try to limit the use of
other volunteers'
tools and equipment.

If you must share, wipe them
down before and after use.



Wear gloves at all times
while on-site.

The type of glove should be
appropriate to the task. Cloth
gloves should not be worn when
operating rotating equipment such
as a drill or powered threading
machine. If gloves are not typically
worn for the task, any type of
glove will work, including nitrile,
latex or vinyl gloves.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose,
or mouth.
